

From January 22 to January 25, 2021, Data for Progress conducted a survey of 1164 likely voters nationally using web panel respondents. The sample was weighted to be representative of likely voters by age, gender, education, race, and voting history. The survey was conducted in English. The margin of error is ±2.9 percentage points.

NB: subgroups with a n-size less than 50 (<50) are not shown on these cross-tabs. We choose not to display N<50 subgroups because the sample is too small to have statistical significance. We did, however, take samples of these subgroups for representational and weighting purposes to accurately reflect the electorate makeup. Some values may not add up to 100 due to rounding.

Some lawmakers in Congress are now suggesting using congressional procedure to allow for the quick passage of a large aid package.

This approach would be different from the standard process for passing legislation -- which requires 60 votes in the Senate. By adding provisions to a budget bill, the Senate could pass some coronavirus relief with just 51 votes.
