

From November 11 to 16, 2021, Data for Progress conducted a survey of 1,298 likely voters nationally using web panel respondents. The sample was weighted to be representative of likely voters by age, gender, education, race, and voting history. The survey was conducted in English. The margin of error is ±3 percentage points.

N=1,298 unless otherwise specified. Some values may not add up to 100 due to rounding.

[1] The Build Back Better framework is a proposal to invest \$1.75 trillion over the next ten years to better fund long-term care for seniors and people with disabilities, expand Medicare coverage to include hearing, invest in clean energy, extend tax credits for families with children, and provide subsidies for child care.
