From September 5 to September 22, 2020, Data for Progress conducted a survey of 889 likely voters in New York using web panel respondents. The sample was weighted to be representative of likely voters by age, gender, education, race, and voting history. The survey was conducted in English. The margin of error is ± 3.3 percentage points.
