

From February 12 to February 13, 2021, Data for Progress conducted a survey of 1234 likely voters nationally using web panel respondents. The sample was weighted to be representative of likely voters by age, gender, education, race, and voting history. The survey was conducted in English. The margin of error is ±3 percentage points.

N=1234 unless otherwise specified. Some values may not add up to 100 due to rounding.

[1] Currently, the federal government and some state governments levy "estate" taxes. When someone dies, the assets they leave behind are called an estate. If the estate is large enough, some portion of the total assets are then taxed, regardless of who inherits it.
