

From March 12 to March 14, 2021, Data for Progress conducted a survey of 1199 likely voters nationally using web panel respondents. The sample was weighted to be representative of likely voters by age, gender, education, race, and voting history. The survey was conducted in English. The margin of error is ±3 percentage points.

[3] The filibuster is a Senate procedure that allows a single Senator to obstruct voting on a bill unless 60 out of 100 Senators overrule them. Currently, Senators who filibuster legislation, preventing it from coming to a vote, do not have to explain why they are doing this. The filibuster is viewed as a way for the minority party to block legislation it disagrees with, and to ensure that one party isn't able to single handedly advance potential bills. Some lawmakers in the Senate are proposing bringing back the "talking filibuster." Under this old rule, Senators blocking a bill had to stand on the Senate floor and explain why they were blocking legislation. Supporters of this argue it's a way to create compromise by forcing Senators to actually debate the issues at hand so they can then reach a compromise. [6] The current federal minimum wage is \$7.25 an hour. The Raise the Wage Act is a proposal to gradually raise it. The minimum wage would first be increased to \$9.50 an hour in 2021. In 2022, 2023, and 2024 it would be raised by an additional \$1.50. Then, in 2025, it would be raised by \$1.00 to \$15 an hour.
