

# DATA FOR PROGRESS

From February 19 to February 22, 2021, Data for Progress conducted a survey of 662 likely voters in Arizona using web panel respondents. The sample was weighted to be representative of likely voters by age, gender, education, race, and voting history. The survey was conducted in English. The margin of error is  $\pm 4$  percentage points.
