From April 30 to May 4, 2021, Data for Progress conducted a survey of 695 likely voters in Georgia using web panel respondents. The sample was weighted to be representative of likely voters by age, gender, education, race, and voting history. The survey was conducted in English. The margin of error is ±4 percentage points

[15] The American Families Plan is proposal to invest \$1.8 trillion in families, workers, and job creation. This includes making childcare more affordable, ensuring all workers have access to paid family and medical leave, funding universal pre-k education, making two years of community college tuition-free, and extending the expanded child tax credit, which provides up to \$250 per month to most families for each child 17 and under and \$300 for children under 6, through 2025.

The American Families Plan will be paid for by raising taxes on Americans making more than \$400,000. In addition, those who earn over \$1 million a year will also pay more in taxes on the income they earn from investing in things like stocks and bonds. This is called the capital gains tax.
