

DATA FOR PROGRESS

From April 30 to May 4, 2021, Data for Progress conducted a survey of 440 likely voters in West Virginia using SMS and web panel respondents. The sample was weighted to be representative of likely voters by age, gender, education, race, and voting history. The survey was conducted in English. The margin of error is ±5 percentage points.

N=440 unless otherwise specified. Some values may not add up to 100 due to rounding.

- Lowering the cost and improving the quality of long term care for seniors and people with disabilities
- Repairing roads, bridges, schools, and water systems
- Investing in American manufacturing and creating jobs in the energy sector
- Expanding, improving, and lowering the cost of internet service
- Modernizing America's electrical grid
- Funding the cleanup of old mines and gas wells

[15] The American Families Plan is proposal to invest \$1.8 trillion in families, workers, and job creation. This includes making childcare more affordable, ensuring all workers have access to paid family and medical leave, funding universal pre-k education, making two years of community college tuition-free, and extending the expanded child tax credit, which provides up to \$250 per month to most families for each child 17 and under and \$300 for children under 6, through 2025.

The American Families Plan will be paid for by raising taxes on Americans making more than \$400,000. In addition, those who earn over \$1 million a year will also pay more in taxes on the income they earn from investing in things like stocks and bonds. This is called the capital gains tax.
