

DATA FOR PROGRESS

From June 12 to 20, 2021, Data for Progress conducted a survey of 1,162 likely voters in New Hampshire using SMS and web panel respondents. The sample was weighted to be representative of likely voters by age, gender, education, race, and voting history. The survey was conducted in English. The margin of error is ±3 percentage points.

N=1162 unless otherwise specified. Some values may not add up to 100 due to rounding.

[1] The American Jobs Plan is a proposal to invest more than \$2 trillion over the next 8 years in America's workforce and infrastructure. The plan includes funding to create millions of jobs doing the following:

- Protecting roads and bridges from flooding, extreme weather, and natural disasters
- Replacing all lead pipes and upgrading public drinking water and wastewater systems
- Expanding broadband internet service so it reaches all Americans
- Investing in new renewable energy projects, like wind and solar power
- Modernizing the energy grid
- Investing in American manufacturing
- Reducing pollution and improving energy efficiency in homes, schools, and childcare centers
- Cleaning up abandoned mines and oil and gas wells

The plan may be paid for by partially undoing the corporate tax cut passed in 2017, which lowered the corporate tax rate from 35% down to 21%. Do you support or oppose the American Jobs Plan?

[10] The American Jobs Plan could invest \$500 billion in clean energy technologies, such as modernizing our electricity grid with efficient and reliable clean energy infrastructure.

Supporters of this investment say that our aging electricity infrastructure is vulnerable. Our economy will suffer without badly-needed investments to create jobs and make our electricity grid low-pollution, safe, and reliable.

Opponents of this say that investing in clean energy technologies is not something that traditionally gets included in infrastructure packages. They say it should be cut from this proposal so that lawmakers can focus on repairing roads, bridges, and water systems.
