

DATA FOR PROGRESS

From July 16 to 19, 2021, Data for Progress conducted a survey of 1,095 likely voters nationally using web panel respondents. The sample was weighted to be representative of likely voters by age, gender, education, race, and voting history. The survey was conducted in English. The margin of error is ± 3 percentage points.

N=1,095 unless otherwise specified. Some values may not add up to 100 due to rounding.

[1] The Protect the Right to Organize (PRO) Act is legislation designed to strengthen labor laws. This proposal would add penalties for companies that retaliate against workers who try to form a union, make it easier for many workers to form a union, and give workers more power during disputes at work.

To pass the PRO Act would require the use of a non-standard procedure called "reconciliation" that allows legislation to pass the Senate with a simple majority.
