

DATA FOR PROGRESS

From September 21 to October 3, 2022, Data for Progress conducted a national survey of 801 young Americans ages 18 to 29 using web panel respondents. The sample was weighted to be representative of 18- to 29-year-old Americans by age, gender, education, race, and voting history. The survey was conducted in English. The margin of error is ± 3 percentage points.

NB: subgroups with a n-size less than 50 (<50) are not shown on these cross-tabs. We choose not to display N<50 subgroups because the sample is too small to have statistical significance. We did, however, take samples of these subgroups for representational and weighting purposes to accurately reflect the electorate makeup. Some values may not add up to 100 due to rounding.
