

From March 4 to 7, 2022, Data for Progress conducted a survey of 1,196 likely voters nationally using web panel respondents. The sample was weighted to be representative of likely voters by age, gender, education, race, and voting history. The survey was conducted in English. The margin of error is ±3 percentage points.

<p>[1] The American Rescue Plan, a \$1.9 trillion pandemic relief package, was signed into law in March 2021. [4] When thinking about how the American Rescue Plan affected **families** during the pandemic, which statement comes closest to your view, even if neither is completely correct?

The package helped families by providing stimulus checks, food assistance, and expanding the child tax credit for all low- and middle-income parents. This relieved parents and allowed children to have all their needs met.	57%	82%	60%	30%

[5] When thinking about how the American Rescue Plan affected **healthcare** during the pandemic, which statement comes closest to your view, even if neither is completely correct?

The package helped healthcare by increasing funding for states' Medicaid programs, providing tax credits for businesses offering paid sick leave, and expanding coronavirus testing and vaccinations.	56%	80%	59%	30%
