

# DATA FOR **PROGRESS**

From March 7 to 14, 2022, Data for Progress conducted a survey of 476 likely voters in New York using web panel respondents. The sample was weighted to be representative of likely voters by age, gender, education, race, and voting history. The survey was conducted in English. The margin of error is  $\pm 4$  percentage points.

N=476 unless otherwise specified. Some values may not add up to 100 due to rounding.

**[1]** Last year, state lawmakers in New York created a \$2.1 billion Excluded Workers Fund to provide unemployment insurance benefits to workers who lost wages or income because of the pandemic, but were ineligible for state unemployment benefits or pandemic relief due to their immigration status.

Some state lawmakers in New York are proposing to provide additional funding for the Excluded Worker Fund, so that workers who were eligible for relief but didn't get a chance to apply before the program stopped accepting applications can receive relief.
