

From February 17 to 18, 2022, Data for Progress conducted a survey of 586 likely voters ages 18 to 29 nationally using web panel respondents. The sample was weighted to be representative of likely voters by age, gender, education, race, and voting history. The survey was conducted in English. The margin of error is ±4 percentage points.
