## **MI DATA FOR PROGRESS**

From April 7 to 13, 2022, Data for Progress conducted a survey of 622 likely voters in New York using web panel respondents. The sample was weighted to be representative of likely voters by age, gender, education, race, and voting history. The survey was conducted in English. The margin of error is ±4 percentage points.

[1] Some New York state lawmakers have introduced a package of bills to end wrongful convictions for crimes.

These bills would ban police from using deceptive interrogation tactics, allow more people who pleaded guilty to crimes they did not commit to file claims to have their cases reviewed, and require that minors consult an attorney before waiving their Miranda rights.
