

# DATA FOR PROGRESS

From August 3 to 10, 2022, Data for Progress conducted a survey of 1,561 likely voters nationally with an oversample of likely voters in Arizona, Georgia, North Carolina, New Hampshire, Nevada, Ohio, Pennsylvania, and Wisconsin using web panel respondents. The sample was weighted to be representative of likely voters by age, gender, education, race, and voting history. The survey was conducted in English. The margin of error is  $\pm 2$  percentage points.

**[25]** Currently, private-sector businesses can fire workers for any reason that does not violate local, state, and federal law. Some lawmakers in Congress are proposing legislation to establish "just cause" terminations.
