

DATA FOR PROGRESS

From February 9 to 10, 2023, Data for Progress conducted a survey of 1,204 likely voters nationally using web panel respondents. The sample was weighted to be representative of likely voters by age, gender, education, race, geography, and voting history. The survey was conducted in English. The margin of error is ±3 percentage points.

This bill aims to reform policing practices in the United States. If passed, it would create a national database of police misconduct, prohibit racial profiling by police officers, ban police use of chokeholds, require body cameras to be used by all federal police officers, and end the practice of "qualified immunity," which prevents government officials from being sued for actions that are unconstitutional or illegal that they performed while on the job.
