

DATA FOR PROGRESS

From May 19 to 22, 2023, Data for Progress conducted a survey of 1,036 LGBTQ+ adults nationally using web panel respondents. Respondents were defined as LGBTQ+ if they identified as LGBTQ+ or transgender, with a sexual orientation other than straight or heterosexual, a gender identity other than male or female, or both. The sample was weighted to be representative of the adult LGBTQ+ community by age, gender, education, and race using the U.S. Census Bureau's Household Pulse Survey (HPS) data on the national LGBTQ+ adult population.

NB: subgroups with a n-size less than 60 (<60) are not shown on these cross-tabs. We choose not to display N<60 subgroups because the sample is too small to have statistical significance. We did, however, take samples of these subgroups for representational and weighting purposes to accurately reflect the electorate makeup. Some values may not add up to 100 due to rounding.
