

# DATA FOR PROGRESS

From July 26 to August 2, 2023, Data for Progress conducted a survey of 1,748 registered voters in Arizona using SMS and web panel respondents, with oversamples in Arizona's 1st and 6th Congressional Districts. The sample was weighted to be representative of registered voters by age, gender, education, race, geography, and voting history. The survey was conducted in English. The margin of error is  $\pm 2$  percentage points.

NB: subgroups with a n-size less than 50 (<50) are not shown on these cross-tabs. We choose not to display N<50 subgroups because the sample is too small to have statistical significance. We did, however, take samples of these subgroups for representational and weighting purposes to accurately reflect the electorate makeup. Some values may not add up to 100 due to rounding.

**[10]** In the U.S. Senate, the filibuster is a rule that allows any Senator to indefinitely block legislation, unless at least 60 of 100 Senators agree to move forward to a vote, allowing a minority of Senators to block popular legislation. The Senate can eliminate the filibuster at any time to allow a bill to pass with a simple majority (51 votes).
