

From June 30 to July 2, 2023, Data for Progress and World Resources Institute conducted a survey of 1,290 likely voters nationally using web panel respondents. The sample was weighted to be representative of likely voters by age, gender, education, race, geography, and voting history. Thesurvey was conducted in English. The margin of error is ±3 percentage points.
