

# DATA FOR PROGRESS

From September 15 to 17, 2023, Data for Progress conducted a survey of 1,194 likely voters nationally using web panel respondents. The sample was weighted to be representative of likely voters by age, gender, education, race, geography, and voting history. The survey was conducted in English. The margin of error is  $\pm 3$  percentage points.

NB: subgroups with a n-size less than 50 (<50) are not shown on these cross-tabs. We choose not to display N<50 subgroups because the sample is too small to have statistical significance. We did, however, take samples of these subgroups for representational and weighting purposes to accurately reflect the electorate makeup. Some values may not add up to 100 due to rounding.

**[1]** During the COVID-19 pandemic, the federal government provided funding through the American Rescue Plan to keep child care centers afloat and operating.

Currently, the funding provided through the American Rescue Plan is set to run out. Researchers estimate that up to 3 million children will be affected by child care centers closing or reducing availability.
