

DATA FOR **PROGRESS**

From January 24 to 30, 2024, Data for Progress and Climate Power conducted a survey of 1,251 Latino likely voters nationally using web panel respondents, including an oversample of Latino likely voters in Arizona, Georgia, Nevada, and Pennsylvania. The sample was weighted to be representative by age, gender, education, geography, and voting history. The survey was conducted in English and Spanish. The margin of error is ± 3 percentage points.

NB: subgroups with a n-size less than 50 (<50) are not shown on these cross-tabs. We choose not to display N<50 subgroups because the sample is too small to have statistical significance. We did, however, take samples of these subgroups for representational and weighting purposes to accurately reflect the electorate makeup. Some values may not add up to 100 due to rounding.
