

From February 28 to March 4, 2024, Data for Progress and Climate Power conducted a survey of 1,289 U.S. likely voters nationally using web panel respondents. The sample was weighted to be representative of likely voters by age, gender, education, race, geography, and voting history. This sample is also weighted to account for an oversample of voters ages 18 to 34 to ensure proportional representation of likely voters. The survey was conducted in English. The margin of error is ±3 percentage points.

NB: subgroups with a n-size less than 50 (<50) are not shown on these cross-tabs. We choose not to display N<50 subgroups because the sample is too small to have statistical significance. We did, however, take samples of these subgroups for representational and weighting purposes to accurately reflect the electorate makeup. Some values may not add up to 100 due to rounding.

**[18]** The Calcasieu Pass 2 (CP2) terminal in Louisiana is a proposed new liquefied natural gas (LNG) export project. The CP2 terminal is projected to ship up to 24 million tons of liquefied natural gas and emit up to 197 tons of carbon dioxide annually.
