

From January 26 to March 8, 2024, Data for Progress conducted 12,392 respondent interviews over 10 pooled surveys of U.S. likely voters nationally using web panel respondents. Each sample was weighted to be representative of likely voters by age, gender, education, race, geography, and voting history. The surveys were conducted in English. The margin of error is ±1 percentage point, and crosstabs of subgroups of the sample are subject to increased margins of error.
