



From October 7 to 8, 2025, Data for Progress conducted a survey of 1,229 U.S. likely voters nationally using web panel respondents. The sample was weighted to be representative of likely voters by age, gender, education, race, geography, and recalled presidential vote. The survey was conducted in English. The margin of error associated with the sample size is ±3 percentage points. Results for subgroups of the sample are subject to increased margins of error. Partisanship reflected in tabulations is based on self-identified party affiliation, not partisan registration. For more information please visit dataforprogress.org/our-methodology.

NB: subgroups with a n-size less than 50 (<50) are not shown on these cross-tabs. We choose not to display N<50 subgroups because the sample is too small to have statistical significance. We did, however, take samples of these subgroups for representational and weighting purposes to accurately reflect the electorate makeup. Some values may not add up to 100 due to rounding.

Statement A: The Democrats are so cruel in their refusal to reopen the government that they forced a food assistance program for the most vulnerable women and children to run out this week. To ensure they don't go hungry because of the Democrats' political games, the Trump administration is using revenue from tariffs to keep the program funded.

Republicans are doing what they can to prevent Americans from getting hurt, but enough is enough. Democrats need to drop their ridiculous demands and end the shutdown.

Statement B: President Trump and Republicans have complete control of the federal government. If they wanted to protect programs that help low-income Americans afford groceries and health care, like WIC and Medicaid, they would start by reversing the cuts they've already passed. Democrats' proposal funds the government and begins to undo the damage Republicans have caused, but Republicans keep holding out.
